The benefits of our real-time GPS tracking OVERVU increases as it reduces the manpower involved in tracking the containers in the yard and offshore, and our clients can now track the units even when they work from home.

John F. Kennedy once says "When written in Chinese, the word crisis is composed of two characters -- one represents danger, and the other represents opportunity." I am a true believer that great opportunity presents in all crises. We just need to think hard and be creative to find those opportunities.

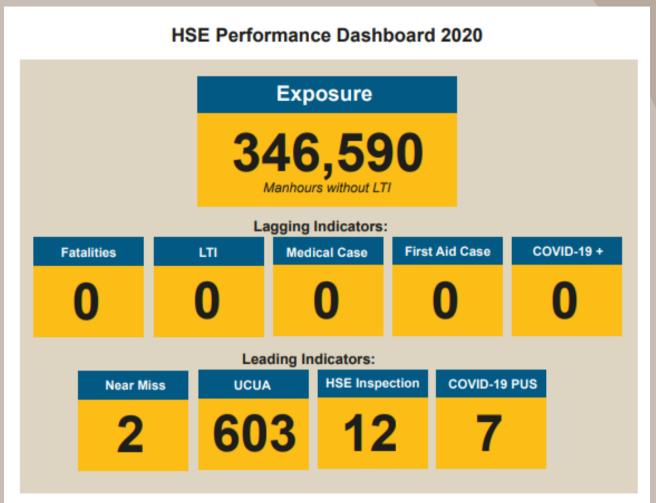

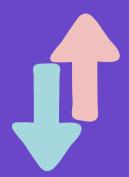

TYPES OF COMMUNICATION AND HOW TO USE THEM EFFECTIVELY



VERBAL

- Use a strong and confident voice.
- Use active listening.
- Avoid filter words.
- Avoid jargon when necessary.

NON-VERBAL

- Deliberate movement and signals.
- Be intentional about your non-verbal communication.
- Ensure to maintain eye contact

VISUAL

- Consider your audience.
- Creating an effective bar chart to show numbers/ figures.
- Use a simple diagram.
- Avoid too many texts in a slide (for presentation).

WRITTEN

- Focus on simplicity.
- Avoid bombastic words.
- Know your audience and engage effective language style.
- Review your writing.
