





Big applause to the team who has generously volunteered directly or indirectly to this wonderful cause. Your deeds of kindness may look small, but their impact on the community is enormous.















For example, workers can get stressed if they feel they don't have the skills or time to meet tight deadlines. Providing planning, training and support can reduce pressure and bring stress levels down.

There are 6 main areas of work

design which can affect stress levels. They are:



DEMANDS

For example, workers may not able to cope with the demands of their jobs.



RELATIONSHIPS

Employees are having trouble with relationships at work, or are being bullied.



CONTROL

Workers may be unable to control the way they do their work.



ROLE

Employees don't fully understand their role and responsibilities.



SUPPORT

Workers don't receive enough information and support.




CHANGE

Employees are not engaged when a business is undergoing change.

Employers should assess the risks in these areas

to manage stress in the workplace. Stress affects people differently – what stresses one person may not affect another. Factors like skills and experience, age or disability may all affect whether a worker can cope.



HOW TO HELP

The earlier a problem is tackled the less impact it will have. If you think that a worker is having problems, encourage them to talk to someone, whether it is their line manager, superior, or their occupational health team. By talking to your workers and understanding how to identify the signs of stress, you can prevent and reduce stress in your workplace.



WHAT YOUR EMPLOYER MUST DO

To protect workers from stress at work, employers should assess risks to their health. Employers have a legal duty to assess the risks to employees' health from stress at work and share the results of any risk assessment with them. Employers may follow HSE's Management Standards approach, which help identify and manage the main causes of stress at work.
