We are aligning our resources and ensuring our vendor network is ready to respond swiftly. After a period of quiet, we are excited to see Kuantan become a vibrant hub once again.

How do you see the region contributing to the overall goals of the company?

The region is where most of the operational activity happens, making proximity to clients a crucial advantage in serving them efficiently and cost-effectively. For example, the Kemaman Supply Base, with its 180 hectares of developed land and 17 berths, plays a pivotal role in supporting petrochemicals and heavy industry in the area. Our Cargo Carrying Units (CCUs) are an essential part of our business, as their demand continues to drive positive outcomes. To ensure our success, it's vital that these units are well-maintained, thoroughly inspected, and ready for use with minimal downtime. What are the most significant opportunities for growth in the region?



BUSINESS UPDATE

12-MONTH OPERATION PERMIT AND ADVANCES NEW WET LEASE FOR RP-R804 HELICOPTER



▶ With support from the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM), Altus Aviation successfully obtained a 12-month Operation Permit, valid from August 2024 to August 2025, to ensure continuity in its aerial services. As part of this effort, Altus Aviation has applied for a new Wet Lease on the RP-R804 helicopter, a lease structure that includes both aircraft and crew.

The RP-R804 helicopter underwent a thorough due diligence inspection, led by Mr. Mohd Fazreen, CAMO Manager, and Mr. Hyder Shahrom, QA Manager from MHS Aviation Berhad. This detailed inspection confirmed the helicopter's compliance with all regulatory standards. Productive meetings were also held with MHS Aviation Berhad

representatives to discuss ongoing progress on the Wet Lease application and potential future collaborations. Discussions with CAAM further addressed approval considerations for the RP-R804 helicopter.







EXPLORING AERIAL FERTILISATION AND RAT BAITING SOLUTIONS WITH FGV PLANTATIONS MALAYSIA

In a strategic expansion, Altus Aviation is developing new aerial application services for fertilisation and rat bait broadcasting in Malaysian oil palm plantations. Using aircraft for aerial fertilisation, Altus Aviation aims to increase efficiency by covering large areas, addressing labour shortages, and enhancing productivity. Additionally, the company is innovating solutions for rat infestations a significant threat to Fresh Fruit Bunch (FFB) production—by offering aerial rat bait broadcasting through helicopters or fixed-wing aircraft.

This venture is in collaboration with Calibre Aviation from Australia, with initial activities underway at the Pusat Penyelidikan Pertanian Tun Razak (PPPTR) in FELDA Tekam. Altus Aviation also recently presented to FGV Plantations Malaysia (FGVPM) CEO, Tuan Haji Hamdan, proposing these aerial services for FGV estates. The detailed presentation at Wisma FGV included key insights on the approach and was attended by the Regional Controller, R&D teams, and agronomists.









MAINTENANCE AND INSPECTIONS FOR HELICOPTER OPERATIONS

The helicopter at Subang Airport has completed a comprehensive inspection and maintenance process, including an Engine Ground Run (EGR) at the Helicopter Centre, ensuring it is in top condition and ready for operational deployment. Concurrently, routine inspections at the MyCopter Hangar were conducted, affirming Altus Aviation's commitment to maintaining all helicopters to the highest standards of safety and performance.

RELAUNCH OF AERIAL SPRAYING







▶ With the newly acquired operation permit for aerial spraying, Altus Aviation is set to resume services in Malaysia's oil palm plantations, specifically addressing pest outbreaks like the recent bagworm infestation. This marks Altus Aviation's first operation after a five-month hiatus, in collaboration with Malaysian Palm Oil Board's (MPOB) anti-bagworm initiative in Beruas, Perak. The program re-launch event was held in Kg. Banjar, Beruas, with distinguished attendance from YB Datuk Chan Foong Hin, Deputy Minister of Plantation and Commodities, along with other state Executive Committees and key stakeholders. To observe the infestation firsthand, YB Datuk Chan Foong Hin and state officials participated in an aerial survey via helicopter. Altus Aviation completed the spraying of 1,796 hectares, overcoming challenging wet weather, with an overall operation time of approximately 90 flying hours.

EXPLORING AERIAL SPRAYING COLLABORATION WITH MAAH





Altus Aviation is expanding its client outreach for aerial spraying services and is currently in discussions with Malaysia Airports Holdings Berhad (MAAH) to address bagworm outbreaks near KLIA. Initial conversations with the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM) have centred on defining protected areas and establishing operational procedures for aerial applications in close proximity to the airport. Altus Aviation will continue to engage with MAAH to further develop the commercial framework and explore technical solutions for effective pest control.

EXPANSION TO KOTA KINABALU





Altus Labuan has recently expanded its operations to include activities in Kota Kinabalu, securing Bintang Subsea Venture (BSV) as its first client in the region. For BSV, Altus Labuan provides comprehensive agency services, including vessel clearance, crew sign-on and sign-off, transportation, port calls at Kota Kinabalu, accommodation arrangements, and ad-hoc services such as equipment supply and procurement. Additionally, Altus Labuan has facilitated the preparation and remobilisation of safety vessels and remotely operated vehicles (ROVs) to the Sabah field. This support involved managing loading and unloading operations, berthing, garbage disposal, transportation, and crew logistics at Kota Kinabalu Port.



VELESTO'S VIP AND CREWING TEAM VISIT

▶ Altus Labuan provided transportation services for Velesto's VIPs during their 3-day visit to Labuan to inspect NAGA 6 at Labuan Shipyard Engineering.

Additionally, Velesto's crewing team conducted vehicle inspections to ensure compliance with HSE and SOP that their crew is travelling safely. They also explained the billing processes to brief the Altus Labuan team on their Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system.

I LAY UP LICENSE RENEWAL



Altus Labuan received a visit from
Jabatan Pelabuhan dan Dermaga Sabah (JPDS)
personnels to inspect the radio room as part of the
procedure for Lay Up License renewal. This license
renewal is important to allow us continuing our
service as an authorised agent in Brunei Bay area.



ALTUS LABUAN ACHIEVES PLATINUM STATUS FOR OSH EXCELLENCE

On 12th August 2024, Altus Labuan was awarded Platinum (Level 5) status in the Stepwise OSH Level Verification and Enhancement for Small and Medium Enterprises (SOLVE 4 SME) program. This initiative, led by the Ministry of Human Resources (MOHR) through the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH), aims to elevate occupational safety and health standards in the SME sector.

The award ceremony was officiated by YBrs. Tuan Sutekno bin Ahmad Belon, Deputy Secretary-General of MOHR, with Mrs. Asni binti Abdullah accepting the award on behalf of Altus Labuan.

OUTWARD CLEARANCES AND ARRIVAL SERVICES





Altus Johor successfully managed a series of crucial vessel operations, ensuring seamless transitions for incoming and outgoing vessels.

Team member Mr. Hazziq, serving as boarding officer, facilitated the outward clearance of vessels El-Nina Samudra and Infiniti 5, supporting their efficient departure to the next port.

For the arrival of Siem Amethyst, Altus Johor's boarding officer, Mr. Hasif, provided comprehensive arrival services. This included coordinating the supply of 200 tonnes of fresh water and managing MGO bunkering for 700 metric tonnes during pilot operations from the 21st July at 1100 hrs to the 23rd July at 0700 hrs.

Additionally, Altus Johor's boarding officer, Mr. Saiful, ensured the successful clearance of Infiniti 5, securing its readiness for onward travel.

On 12th September, at Port of Tanjung Pelepas (PTP), Mr. Hazziq and Mr. Saiful concluded the outward clearance process for Infiniti Virtus / Infiniti 7, preparing it for its next destination.

CREST HYDRA MOBILISATION AND OPERATIONS AT TANJUNG LANGSAT PORT AND JOHOR PORT



Crest Hydra arrived at Tanjung Langsat Port (TLP) for offshore equipment mobilisation before heading to Johor Port (JPB) for reel loading and bunkering operations. Altus Johor expertly managed the TLP operations, overseeing hot work applications, cargo mobilisation and clearance, coordination of gate passes for trucks and personnel, as well as the deployment of equipment and manpower, with comprehensive monitoring throughout the first day.

On the second day, Altus Johor conducted operational planning discussions with client EET Engineering Services Sdn. Bhd. in preparation for activities at JPB. The reel loading for Crest Hydra was successfully completed on the final day, allowing for the vessel's timely departure to Bintulu.

In addition to these mobilisation efforts, Altus Johor managed demobilisation activities for Crest Hydra and Ena Endeavour.



Ena Endeavour berthed at JPB on 25th August for a one-day port stay, while Crest Hydra called at JPB on 28th August, where Altus Johor facilitated personnel and truck gate passes, trucking arrangements, cargo clearance, and comprehensive port services including equipment and manpower deployment. Altus Johor also handled the vessel's inward and outward clearance, ensuring smooth operations. The demobilisation of Crest Hydra concluded successfully on 29th August, with agency responsibilities handed over to the vessel's owner. This marked the final stage of Altus's involvement, ensuring a smooth transition for Crest Hydra's subsequent activities.









SMOOTH HANDOVER OF PORT CLEARANCE FOR UPCOMING PROJECTS AT JOHOR PORT

▶ On 26th July, Altus Johor's boarding officer successfully handed over the port clearance document to the Port Master at Johor Port Berhad (JPB), ensuring a smooth pathway for upcoming projects. Altus Johor personnel, Mr. Hazziq, was responsible for overseeing the handover process, facilitating seamless coordination with JPB.

ALTUS JOHOR COMPLETES PLKS FORMALITIES FOR GU MELOR CREW

▶ In the previous quarter, Altus Johor managed berthing slot and vessel clearance activities at Johor Container Terminal, Johor Port, for TB Melor and GU Melor 1. For the crew members, Altus Johor arranged and successfully submitted the Pas Lawatan Kerja Sementara (PLKS) documents to Setia Tropika Immigration.

On 5th August, following the completion of the sign-off formalities, Altus Johor facilitated the cancellation of the PLKS document for a GU Melor crew member, as requested by GU Shipping.





WEEKLY IN-HOUSE TRAINING FOR SENIOR OPERATIONS STAFF

▶ Throughout August, Altus Johor conducted weekly in-house training sessions focused on enhancing the skills and knowledge of senior operations staff. This initiative aimed to improve operational efficiency and ensure that the team is well-equipped to handle various challenges.

COLLABORATIVE MEETINGS FOR UPCOMING BITUMEN PROJECT SIMULATION

▶ The Altus Johor team, together with Altus Oilfield Solutions business unit, and representatives from Baiduri Dimensi Haulage, Tanjung Langsat Port, and Langsat Oilfield Supply Centre (LOSC), held a



strategic meeting in Pasir Gudang, Johor. The session focused on a detailed simulation for the upcoming Bitumen Project, ensuring all partners are aligned for successful execution.


TANJUNG BIN

WAREHOUSE SITE VISIT

▶ Representatives from Altus Logistics Solutions business unit and SAPURA Rail Systems attended a warehouse site visit at Altus Johor. The visit aimed to evaluate the warehouse's capabilities, infrastructure, and operational readiness for upcoming projects. Discussions focused on aligning Altus Johor with the specific requirements of SAPURA Rail Systems.



ALTUS JOHOR SUPPORTS RIG CEAN DEPARTURE

▶ On 26th & 27th August, a pre-operation meeting took place with representatives from Best Oasis, the port authority, and the Altus Johor team to align on operational procedures, safety protocols, and project objectives for Rig Cean's upcoming departure.

Altus Johor has been involved with Rig Cean since the second quarter, providing support for provisioning, deballast operations, crew change formalities, transportation, and the arrangement for the Marine Warranty Surveyor (MWS) to board the rig and complete required reports.

On 28th August, Captain Japgal Manmeet, MWS for Rig Cean, was picked up at 1100 hrs from the airport and transported to Pasir Puteh Jetty, where he boarded a launch boat to Rig Cean. During his visit, he conducted a monthly inspection and issued a report for Best Oasis.

On 29th August, Captain Manmeet attended another pre-operations meeting with Johor Port Berhad (JPB) to prepare for the rig's second departure attempt to Alang, India.

On 4th September, the Altus Johor team, in collaboration with JPB Marine, conducted an on-site visit to Rig Cean at Ramunia Anchorage. They assessed the rig's status and reviewed final operational details, with Mr. Suria from Best Oasis also in attendance. This visit facilitated in-depth discussions on towing arrangements and preparations for the departure window.



VISIT BY SUMISAUJANA REPRESENTATIVES

Representatives from SumiSaujana (SSTCM) visited to discuss a potential warehouse project focused on the storage and transfer of isotanks, along with haulage services. The proposed project would operate under a 1-year contract, emphasising safe and efficient handling of isotanks. Discussions during the visit centred on the required capacity, safety protocols, and operational efficiency needed to meet SSTCM's standards.



CHAIRMAN AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR VISIT





Chairman of Altus Malaysia, Mr. Bustami, and Executive Director of Altus Aviation, Major Zulkifli, visited Altus Johor for an informal gathering that included open discussion sessions with colleagues. The session encouraged open communication, engagement, and collaboration among all participants.

TRAINING ON MALAYSIA MARITIME SINGLE WINDOW AND eMANIFEST SERVICE

Dagang Net Technologies Sdn Bhd is organising training sessions on the Malaysia Maritime Single Window (MMSW) and the eManifest service, part of the National Single Window (NSW) platform. This initiative aims to facilitate the implementation of MMSW and ensure stakeholders are well-equipped to utilise the eManifest service effectively. Our Altus Johor staff, Hasif and Saiful attended this training held at New York Hotel, Johor Bahru on 11th September.





▶ Our Altus Kemaman team, led by Mr. Tengku Amir and Mr. Fauzi, successfully supported wells start-up activities at the Gansar platform. We supplied and decanted 8 tote tanks and filled with methanol solvent for SumiSaujana TCM Chemicals Sdn. Bhd. (SSTCM), which were successfully delivered to HHA Associates Sdn. Bhd.





ALTUS TOK BALI ENHANCES CHE SAFETY WITH CCU QAQC TRAINING

▶ Altus Tok Bali conducted a CCU Quality Assurance & Quality Control (QAQC) training session led by Mr. Muhammad Arif Fahmi Supian from Siaptek. Representatives from various Altus regions participated in this training to improve their understanding of Cargo Handling Equipment (CHE). The session focused on identifying key issues in CHE readiness, mastering handling techniques, and performing pre-trip checklists to ensure transportation safety before deployment.





SEAMLESS OPERATIONS ON-HIRE AND ASSET TRANSFERS

On 25th July 2024, our client Expet Control Sdn. Bhd. began on-hiring our cylinder rack and visited our Altus Tok Bali yard to store their materials and collect their unit, with full assistance from our Altus Tok Bali staff.

On 17th August, Atigra Sdn. Bhd. on-hired six of our units, which were collected from the Tok Bali yard. The units comprised two bottle racks, one container, two mini containers, and one cargo basket. Our staff provided hands-on support during the pickup process, utilising Material Handling Equipment (MHE) from the Tok Bali Supply Base to ensure efficient and safe handling.

In addition, on 4th September, Altus Tok Bali carried out an asset transfer, moving equipment to Altus Kemaman for storage and maintenance. The transfer included a heavy-duty container, a half-height basket, two mini containers, and one tote tank. The Altus Kemaman team arranged for a prime mover to collect and transport the units, with the convoy departing Tok Bali at 8 p.m., ensuring the safe and timely arrival at Kemaman for further handling. Finally, on 12th September, our Altus Tok Bali team conducted a sling rod installation to the units at our chemical warehouse in Altus Tok Bali yard.

► The Altus Marine Solutions business unit recently hosted a 2-day Factory Acceptance Test (FAT) for the Robotic Inspection Mission for Automation (RIMAu), in collaboration with PETRONAS Digital Sdn. Bhd. (PDSB), Petronas Gas Berhad (PGB), and the ExRobotic team, at our headquarters in Kuala Lumpur. The meeting also aimed to discuss the next steps for RIMAu deployment.

Additionally, Altus Marine Solutions business unit conducted another FAT on Robot Autonomous Configuration at the PETRONAS Regasification Terminal Pengerang (RGTP) in Johor, alongside PDSB, PGB, and ExRobotic. Several tests were conducted on Points of Interest (POI) on site, including evaluations of the camera's 20x optical zoom and 360-degree panning capabilities (both up and down), the robot's manoeuvrability on gravel and metal grating, and the gas sensors' activation and ability to display Parts Per Million (PPM) readings.

A Customer Success Journey (CSJ) session was also conducted to provide familiarisation training on the robot's autonomous mission features and operation interface.



Altus Marine Solutions business unit was invited to exhibit their innovative robotic solutions, ExR-2 and VAR, at the OSH Innovation & Technology in IR 4.0 Expo 2024, held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC) from 28th to 30th August 2024. Joining them, AFM Fulfillment showcased their own Autonomous Ground Vehicle (AGV) solution, further emphasising Altus's commitment to innovation across sectors.

The exhibition aimed to highlight how Altus Malaysia's advanced robotics enhance safety and efficiency through cutting-edge technology.

▶ As the next step, GETS will perform a trial test on the sample items at their yard. This trial is critical for validating the performance of the materials after the blasting, cleaning, and painting processes.

The programme was designed to introduce participants to the world of robotics, helping to develop and empower their interest, knowledge, and skills in this field.

The participants comprised of 23 students from SMK Damansara Damai 1, SMK Seksyen 8 Kota Damansara, SMK Lembah Subang, and SMK Taman Selayang. MALAY:

SILAT

Silat is the most well-known traditional martial art in Malaysia, with a rich history and deep cultural significance. There are around 30 distinct variations of Silat that are actively practice, such as Silat Seni Gayong and Silat Cekak. Silat is also performed as a ceremonial dance during cultural events and is recognised as an essential part of Malay heritage.

CHINESE:

KONGZHU OR CHE LING

Kongzhu (空竹), also known as Che Ling (扯図) (Chinese Yo-Yo), is a traditional Chinese toy and form of performance art that involves spinning and manipulating a large spool (diabolo) on a string attached to two hand sticks. It is a popular activity both in China and internationally, particularly for its combination of physical skill, coordination, and artistic expression.





INDIAN: KABADDI

The word "Kabaddi" is derived from the Tamil word kai-pidi, which means "hold hands," reflecting one of the core elements of the sport where players often hold hands to form a chain in defence. Kabaddi's roots trace back over 4,000 years to ancient India. The game has references in ancient Indian epics like the Mahabharata, where warriors were skilled in strategies like modern-day Kabaddi tactics.

MALAYSIAN BORNEO: SUMPIT

Sumpit (blowpipe) shooting, is a traditional sport and game that originated from the hunting practices of indigenous communities, particularly the Dayak people of Borneo in Malaysia and Indonesia. In Malaysia, it is often featured in local festivals and cultural events, like Pesta Kaamatan and Gawai Dayak, where it serves to showcase the skills of indigenous people and their connection to their heritage.
