

## STRENGTH IN OPERATIONS HEART IN LEADERSHIP

In the fast-paced world of oil and gas, logistics, precision and consistency are everything. At Altus Oil & Gas Malaysia (AOGM), much of that responsibility falls on the shoulders of Mrs. Saliza, Head of Operations. Known for her forward-thinking leadership, she has guided teams through complex projects across Johor and beyond. We sat down with her to learn more about her journey, her perspective on leading in operations, and one project that truly reflects the spirit of Altus. What followed was an insightful conversation about leadership, execution, and the drive to deliver excellence in every mission.

### Q: How did you start your journey in oil and gas?

I began my career with a Norwegian shipping company, gaining hands-on exposure to shipping and logistics while sharpening my leadership skills. Drawn to the challenges of oil and gas, I expanded into offshore logistics and terminal coordination, where each role deepened my technical expertise and people management. At AOGM, I first served as Branch Manager in Johor before stepping into the Head of Operations role. Over the past four years, I've grown alongside a resilient and dedicated team, and I feel privileged to lead operations marked by collaboration, challenges, and progress.

### Q: Could you share one project that really stands out as impactful for AOGM?

One of the highlights for me was leading projects in Johor with Japan Drilling Co. — first with Hakuryu 11 in 2022 and more recently Hakuryu 16. It wasn't just about moving parts; it meant handling work permits, managing taxation for foreign crew, and ensuring full compliance with local requirements. It was high-stakes and complex, but it proved what AOGM can achieve when clients, authorities, and our teams work hand in hand.



Regulatory requirements were very strict, and timelines were tight. We managed this by staying close to the authorities, double-checking compliance at every stage, and being flexible when circumstances shifted. Honestly, it was the team's professionalism and dedication that pulled everything together.

### Q: AOGM manages many projects at once. How do you ensure safety, compliance, and efficiency?

### FROM THE GROUND UP



In partnership with the Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB), AVM participated in the Bagworm Census Training programme in Johor and Perak. This hands-on initiative equipped the team with practical field insights to support early detection of pest outbreaks and more accurate aerial treatment planning.



By nurturing this expertise internally, AVM enhances its role in integrated pest management (IPM) for plantation partners. The programme reflects how the division bridges field-level realities with advanced aerial solutions, supporting sustainability and data-driven agriculture.

## A SKY CLEARED FOR FLIGHT

Altus Aviation also secured a major regulatory milestone with the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia's (CAAM) approval of its new wet lease application for RP-R804 helicopter. The approval followed extensive documentation reviews, inspections, and compliance checks.

With operations expected to resume in October 2025, the aircraft's return to service underscores AVM's commitment to maintaining continuity for its plantation clients while upholding aviation's highest standards.





## INVESTING IN LEADERSHIP FOR TOMORROW

Leadership development also took centre stage this quarter. Mr. Hariz, Ground Support/Safety Manager, participated in the Palm Oil Leadership Series (POLES), hosted by SD Guthrie Plantation. The programme brought together themes of sustainability, innovation, and industry strategy, equipping participants with the insights needed to lead the palm oil industry into a greener and more resilient future.

# EMBRACING THE FUTURE WITH DRONE CAPABILITIES

A step forward in innovation came with Mr. Aiman, Operation Executive, earning his Remote Pilot Certificate of Competency (RCoC-B) under the Civil Aviation Directive CAD 6011. This certification positions AVM to begin integrating drone technology into its services.

The achievement represents the company's first step in organically building drone capabilities — training talent, securing certifications, and gradually expanding into datarich, precise, and safer aerial solutions. This milestone sets the stage for AVM's evolution in meeting the industry's future demands.

## ANCHORING COLLABORATION AT JOHOR PORT BERHAD (JPB)

On 1st July 2025, Altus participated in a stakeholder engagement session with Johor Port's Offshore Inspection, Maintenance & Repair (OIMR) department, appointed vendors, and clients. Representing AOGM was Mr. Zulfadli, who joined the discussions on behalf of the operations team.

The session was not just another round of technical discussions. It was an opportunity to align expectations, iron out execution details, and make sure every party understood the road ahead. From reviewing vendor readiness to ensuring procedures stayed in line with port requirements, the dialogue was practical yet forward-looking.




By the end of the day, the outcome was clear: a shared commitment to safety, compliance, and timelines. More importantly, the engagement reinforced a spirit of cooperation — the kind that ensures upcoming operations at Johor Port will run with precision and confidence.

For AOGM, being part of such conversations is more than representation. It is about playing our role as a bridge between stakeholders, strengthening trust, and helping shape smooth, efficient operations that serve the energy industry.

## SMOOTH SAILING FOR HAKURYU 16

July 2025 was a busy month for AOGM Operations in Johor, as the team supported a series of activities tied to the Hakuryu 16 project. Each step showcased AOGM's ability to balance regulatory compliance, client priorities, and operational readiness.

It began with a coordination meeting at Johor Port's Marine Building, where AOGM joined discussions with Johor Port, Eneos, and Franklin Offshore to align on the upcoming mooring activity. The session ensured that safety, logistics, and timelines were clearly mapped out, setting the foundation for smooth execution.





AOGM continued its support during the Immigration Malaysia inspection onboard Hakuryu 16. Mr. Luthfil and Mr. Izzat worked closely with the vessel crew and authorities, ensuring documentation and crew lists were complete, communication flowed seamlessly, and statutory requirements were met without a hitch.

Then came the move from planning to heavy execution. On 6th September 2025, the Johor team coordinated the tug and barge operation to load an 800-tonne wire reel in support of Hakuryu 16's mooring change. From managing logistics and scheduling to ensuring safe barge movement and compliance, the operation marked a significant milestone. The barge successfully arrived at Johor Anchorage and cleared alongside CB Isamigo in just 3 minutes later, then began preparations for the multi-week loading and discharge activity.


The support for Hakuryu 16 continued the very next day, 7th –9th September, as the team coordinated the safe loading of massive wire reels across two busy ports — Johor Port and Tanjung Langsat Port (TLP). The first reels were staged and secured onto trailers ahead of schedule, with permit-to-work (PTW) and hot work approvals in place. Despite heavy rain, strong currents, and unpredictable weather, the mooring change progressed safely, a testament to careful planning and unwavering teamwork.











Altus Oil & Gas Malaysia was entrusted by Johor Port Berhad (JPB) to safely remove and dispose of two legacy quay cranes, CC7 and CC8, at Johor Port, Pasir Gudang. The operation, carried out between 14th August and 2nd September 2025, was a key milestone in preparing berth space for new ZPMC cranes that will expand the port's operational capacity.

Taking down structures of this scale in a live port environment was no small task. The dismantling, skidding, and loadout had to be executed with precision, while ensuring minimal disruption to JPB's day-to-day operations. Project Manager, Mr. Nazir, steered the overall planning and delivery, while on site, Mr. Danial led the crew as Site Supervisor to keep every stage running safely and smoothly.

involved multiple The operation high-risk activities — from heavy lifting and welding to seafastening and barge transfers timed with tidal windows. To keep everything in sync, Mrs. Saliza, as Head of Operations, coordinated the big picture with support from Mr. Syahril (operations), Ms. Hazwani (logistics coordination), and Mr. Zulfadli (shipping execution). Safety was at the heart of the campaign, upheld by Mr. Rosli and Ms. Dalila, who were on the ground daily as site safety officers, conducting toolbox talks, enforcing PPE, and monitoring risks in real time.





Across 20 days, a dedicated team of 23 personnel worked in tight coordination to complete the dismantling and removal of both cranes. The result: the project was finished on schedule, with zero safety incidents and minimal operational disruption for Johor Port. By the end of the campaign, CC7 and CC8 were fully removed, and the berth was handed back, ready to welcome the port's new cranes.





A huge shout-out to every Altusian who made this success possible. From planning to execution, each role played a critical part in ensuring the project's safe and timely completion. This achievement is a testament not just to Altus' expertise in heavy-lift and port logistics, but to the teamwork, discipline, and commitment of our people.



### SUPPORTING ATT TRANSPORT'S EXPORT & REIMPORT

Altus Johor once again showcased its expertise in handling specialised logistics. This time with a temporary export and reimport clearance for ATT's transformer at Johor Port.

Leading the coordination was Mr. Ridwan, who managed the critical paperwork and ensured every step alianed with customs and port preparing requirements. From documentation to liaising directly with the relevant authorities, his role was central to keeping the process seamless.

The transformer's movement was completed successfully, without setbacks, and in full compliance with regulations.



### **RESCUE BOAT** LIFT **FOR ENEOS**

AOGM supported Eneos Drilling Limited in safely unloading a fast rescue boat from its container to Warehouse 3E at Johor Port. The task demanded careful coordination and strict adherence to safety procedures.

Leading the effort, Mr. Hairol Asroh oversaw the lifting process from start to finish, ensuring clear communication between the client, port authority, and warehouse team. His supervision helped guarantee that every step was carried out efficiently and without incident.

The operation concluded successfully with the rescue boat safely transferred and stored, meeting client expectations.





### STEERING THE FROM JOURNEY OF PREPARATION MTC LEDANG:


## TO BERTHING



The movement of an FPSO is never a single event — it is a campaign of precision, planning, and teamwork. For MTC Ledang, Altus was entrusted to support client Vestigo in a Transportation & Installation (T&I) campaign, ensuring every stage of the journey unfolded seamlessly.







The campaign started with a towing mission. AOGM coordinated the tow of FPSO MTC Ledang from OPL Johor to MMHE, with Permata Ratu leading and Perdana Expedition securing the tail. The voyage from Jitang Field - Kemaman - Johor required constant communication between the Johor and Kemaman operations teams.

That same day, the story reached its milestone as the FPSO successfully berthed at Johor Port. With Altus overseeing the berthing activity, teams ensured safe manoeuvring, marine coordination, and port alignment. Once the vessel was securely in place, the stage was set for the next phase of works at MMHE.

From premobilisation preparations in Kemaman to the final berthing in Johor. This success reflects not only strong technical execution but also the power of teamwork across regions — a proof point of what Altus can deliver when precision and partnership meet.

## BBC JADE PIPE LOADING SUCCESS

Johor team successfully coordinated the pipe loading operations for BBC Jade at Johor Port, supporting Berlian McDermott's project requirements.

The task involved careful handling and tallying of 58 pipes ex OY7A and 2 pipes ex Serimax, ensuring every step met strict safety and operational standards. Mr. Syahril and Mr.. Fathurrahman took the lead in supervising the operation, managing real-time communication between cargo owners, the terminal, and vessel teams.

By the end of the day, BBC Jade safely departed Johor Port, fully loaded and ready for its next leg.







## NIGHT MOVES AT TANJUNG LANGSAT

On 14th September, the Johor team shifted gears to support a highly specialised operation — the discharge of a data centre module at Tanjung Langsat Port. Unlike regular daylight operations, this one was set to unfold under the night sky.

AOGM coordinated every detail: logistics readiness, equipment checks, manpower allocation, and stakeholder communication. Safety remained the cornerstone of planning, with the team ensuring compliance measures were in place before the first lift.

By nightfall, resources and personnel stood ready on site, prepared to oversee the smooth and secure discharge of the module. With meticulous coordination across port authorities, the vessel, and the operations team, the groundwork was laid for yet another seamless execution.

## ALTUS BINTULU MARKS PROJECT COMPLETION WITH BERLIAN MCDERMOTT

From the busy waters of Johor, AOGM journey carried on to Bintulu, where the operations team once again proved the strength of seamless coordination and steady hands under pressure.

On 23rd July, Bintulu Port Jetty became the stage for a complex backload activity involving not just one, but three vessels under Berlian McDermott—DSV Van Gogh, BW63, and Ekspress85.

The day began with the Van Gogh, a vessel that demanded the sheer muscle of a 300-tonne crane, supported by four trailers and four forklifts working in unison.

Not long after, the BW63 arrived with its own set of requirements, calling for a 200-tonne crane, bunkering coordination, and additional cargo handling. Each vessel brought its own challenges, but the rhythm of the operation never faltered.

Meanwhile, the Ekspress85 added another dimension to the day. Alongside its backload activities, the safe sign-off of eight crew members was carried out. Documentation checks, briefings, and clearances blended into the logistics work already underway, as the team balanced the needs of cargo and crew with equal precision.

At the heart of this operation were Mr. Adam and Mr. Aidelsham, whose leadership ensured that nothing was left to chance. They coordinated berthing schedules, managed quay access, and kept close communication with port, customs, and marine representatives to keep the workflow smooth.

After a meticulous operation that demanded precision and teamwork, a wrap up dinner was held on 25th July 2025 at Peace Garden Restaurant to mark the successful completion of Shell's Offshore T&I for the FaS Pipeline & Heavy Lift Project. The evening brought together project teams. and stakeholders management, in celebration of a complex campaign delivered safely and efficiently.

Special recognition was given to the AOGM Operations Team, led by Mr. Adam, whose steadfast support in logistics and marine operations ensured smooth execution from mobilisation through to demobilisation.

Bintulu team welcomed PETRONAS Management and the SSTCM team for an i-CARE & Contract Execution Assurance visit, with a focus on chemical handling and overall operational safety. 




## STRENGTHENING SAFETY AND COMPETENCY: ALTUS' HSE FOCUS IN JULY

On 6th August 2025, our team conducted an internal audit at AFF, verifying adherence to vendor, operational, and safety requirements. The QHSE team led the audit, assessing conformity with internal procedures and identifying areas for improvement.

Following this, from 18th August to 2nd September 2025, Altus extended its safety oversight to transportation, carrying out vehicle inspections across Kota Bharu, Kuala Terengganu, Kemaman, Kota Kinabalu, Labuan, Johor Bahru, Bintulu, and Miri. Led by Ms. Dalila, Ms. Aqilah, Mr. Aidelsham, and Mr. Syahzeel, the team checked critical safety components, including seatbelts, emergency equipment, and overall vehicle condition. Any non-compliances were flagged for immediate rectification, ensuring that all vehicles met HSE standards and that operational teams could move safely across regions.

Continuing the digital momentum from the previous quarter, Altus IT team has officially kicked off Phase 2 of the Odoo project, marking an exciting step toward smarter and more connected operations.
